<p>Thank you Madame President</p>	<p>A huge thank you goes to Beth Young who will be completing her first two year term as President of the Board in June. In this capacity Beth has led our congregation with the Rabbi through a list of jobs public and behind the scenes. She has cajoled, networked, soothed, initiated, held fast, redirected, taught, celebrated, guided, supported, cooked, cleaned, traveled, lectured and inspired our community.</p> <p>Thank you Beth! We appreciated your tireless gifts to the congregation that makes us a community.</p>
<p>From the Rabbi's Desk</p>	<p>My dear fellow Valley Jews and Friends, Shalom. Finally! Warmer weather, sunshine, and a sense of spring.</p> <p>Calendar NISAN → IYAR (APRIL)</p> <p>Nisan (a thirty day month) began March 16th, and runs until April 14th. Iyar (a twenty-nine day month) begins on April 15th, and runs until May 13th. Rosh Chodesh for Iyar is April 14th and 15th</p> <p>Holidays</p> <p>Pesach (Passover) continues as we start April. The holiday began the evening of March 29th with the first Seder, and will run until the evening of April 6th.</p> <p>We also continue the count of the Omer, as we observe the time between Passover and Shavuot. We started the count on the second day of Passover, which includes March 31st, so April 1st will be the second day of the Omer, and so on. May 2nd is Lag Be'Omer, the 33th day of the counting of the Omer. The Omer count will continue for 49 days, with the 50th day being Shavuot (the Festival of Weeks), starting the 5th of Sivan, the evening of May 18th.</p> <p>We will have a Shabbat Shacharit (morning) service at Beth El on April 3rd, at 10 am, during which we will recite a section of the Shir Hashirim (Song of Songs).</p> <p>There will also be a Shabbat Shacharit (morning) service at THOI on April 10th, at 10 am, which is after Passover ends. At that service we will take note of and celebrate the modifications to the building to make it accessible. In lieu of a standard sermon, Rabbi Lynne Landsberg, formerly rabbi for the two congregations in the Valley in Harrisonburg and Staunton, and now the Senior Advisor on Disability Issues at the Religious Action</p>

Center of Reform Judaism, will address us. If you haven't heard Rabbi Landsberg speak, you should do all you can to take advantage of this wonderful opportunity.

The evening of April 10th and day of April 11th is Nisan 27th, the day on which we commemorate Yom HaSho'ah, Holocaust Remembrance Day. We will have a Community Yom HaSho'ah observance on Saturday evening, April 10th at 7 pm at Temple House of Israel, incorporates the closing event in the programming for the Shenandoah Valley Holocaust Education Project (SVHEP), as well as Havdalah and a brief commemorative service. All are invited to join us for this event.

April 19th coincides with Iyar 5 this year, which is Yom Ha'atzma'ut (Israel Independence Day). This is the day in 1948 (5708 on the Jewish calendar) when the modern state of Israel was declared.

Torah Parashiot

The Torah parashiot (Torah portions) read for the period covered by this newsletter include the following:

Shabbat Chol Hamoed Pesach, Shemini, Tazria-Metzora, and Achare-Kedoshim, drawn from Shemot (Ex.) 33:12-34:26; Bamidbar (Num.) 28:19-25; and Vayikra (Lev.) 9:1-20:27.

Haftarot read on Shabbatot (Sabbaths) include selections from Ezekiel 37, 2 Samuel 6-7; 2 Kings 7; and Amos 9.
